3. Assessments in Term 2

a. Minister Chan Chun Sing shared at the recent MOE COS Debate 2022 on "how our [assessments] can be less stressful":



How can our exams be less stressful for our students?

Much depends on our perspectives on 4 questions - why we test, how we test, when we test and what do we do with the test results?

Exams can be less stressful if we help our children understand:

- Exams are about learning their own strengths and weaknesss, surpassing themselves rather than surpassing others.
- We are focused on solving tomorrow's problems with tomorrow's solutions, and not regurgitating yesterday's solutions for yesterday's problems.
- Our education system is underpinned by continuous meritocracy no single exam/ test will determine one's future.
- We must understand our own strengths and interests, and choose a path suited for ourselves rather than chase paths deem more popular by the standards of others.

Let us help our children to embrace and overcome challenges, and seize the diverse opportunities in life. We cannot shield them from all stress but we can certainly equip them with the right mindsets and skillsets to face the future with confidence.

- b. A letter with the detailed Common Test (Sec 1 to 3) / Examination (Sec 4/5) schedule will be issued to parents by Week 3, Term 2 latest. The assessments will commence by Week 6, Term 2. The assessment outcomes will help the school determine appropriate intervention and improvement plans and strategies for our girls.
- c. Our PL-Lites should strive to nurture a positive learning attitude and revision routine for the upcoming assessments (for e.g. note-taking and time management skills they

have picked up in their PL21 lessons). Please work with us to encourage our girls to work towards giving their best in the upcoming weeks leading to the assessments so that the school's follow-up interventions can be more targeted to help them achieve their potential and goals. Our teachers will also be at hand to give consultations to those who need extra help.

4. Updates in Safe Management Measures (SMMs)

a. Singapore's streamlined COVID-19 SMMs came into effect on Tuesday, 15 March 2022. Most SMMs in schools remain similar. However, with the easing of SMMs, the school is planning to introduce Level(s) Assembly (maximum of two levels) in Term 2. Format and approaches taken in CCA trainings and for the upcoming National School Games could also take a different form.

Sec 1 and Sec 3 PL-Lites can look forward to their upcoming Cohort Camp and MOE-OBS Challenge respectively, while we hope to inspire our Sec 4/5 girls through our annual ECG Conference Keynote Speaker Ms Ho Ren Yung, Vice-President of Banyan Tree Group in May 2022.
