# Principal's Letter to Parents Term 1, 2024

**Dear Parents/Guardians** 

A new school year will start in a few days. I would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new Secondary 1 cohort and their parents/guardians. I would also like to welcome all pupils and their families back to the school community. Schooling is a family affair for us at PL.

Importantly, we welcome our new Vice-Principal, Ms Susan Toh, who joined us two weeks ago. Together with Ms Toh, I look forward to building strong relationships with all members of the PL family – staff, parents and students – and to learn and grow alongside students and colleagues.

Today marks the beginning of a new chapter in our Singapore education system. With Full Subject-Based Banding (SBB) in all secondary schools in Singapore, there will no longer be separate Express, N(A) and N(T) course, and students will be in mixed form classes where they can interact with peers of different strengths and interests.

PL (Sec) was 1 of the 28 Pilot Schools that started the Full SBB in 2020. School Leaders and staff before me have worked hard and achieved much to give the Ministry the confidence to select PL (Sec) as a pilot school. It is our privilege to serve and we have learnt much in the last few years. For one, it is never easy for young people of diverse needs and interests to learn and live together. Hence, providing our girls the opportunities to interact and bond, to learn about themselves, to empathise and respect differing perspectives, are just some aspects we must work on to prepare our girls to *Just Shine!* in this uncertain world and future. With our varied Full SBB experiences, we will continue to improve and are confident that we will be able to make a difference in our girls' learning and growth.

A new year brings new hopes and new opportunities. 2024 brings new beginnings. I pray and trust that we will all learn, unlearn, relearn, to be better and stronger versions of ourselves each day. I pray we learn to fix our eyes on God as our ultimate goal, because in Him, we can truly be fearless and immovable - our 2024 Year Theme "Be True, Pure, Strong and Brave".

Together with my colleagues, we look forward to partnering you to nurture every PL-Lite to *Just Shine!* and be the beacon to the community, by bringing hope to those around them through faith and courage.

## 5. Student Learning and Development Updates

- i. <u>'Start Right Programme in Week 1, Term 1</u>. We begin the second year of our 'Start Right' Programme in the first week of school. In Week 1, we will focus on nurturing positive relationships and establishing positive expectations and routines to support our girls' learning and growth for the rest of the year. #### 6. Supporting Your Daughter During Transitions and Change

The Sec 1 and Sec 3 years are transitional years that our PL-Lites need to adapt to new schooling experiences, make new friends and explore new leadership opportunities. Our Sec 2 and Sec 4/5 PL-Lites will also experience change and new challenges. We want to inculcate within all our girls the ability to thrive despite challenges.

#### 7. Other Admin Matters

i. <u>School Canteen Prices</u>. In the recent 1-2 years, we have seen a significant inflationary trend in food prices from the Department of Statistics (DOS) and NEA's hawker price survey. MOE also considered the 2023 canteen price data from the School Canteen Survey results. To ensure that our canteen price range reflects these cost pressures, there will be a 10- to 40-cent increase in some of our canteen prices from Jan 2024.

Our meal subsidies for PL-Lites on the Financial Assistance Scheme have also been adjusted accordingly. No PL-Lite should be affected by the changes. ii. <u>School's Traffic Safety and School Security Arrangement</u>. Our girls' safety is our priority. Please see **Annex – Traffic Safety & School Security Arrangements**, a useful reminder for our current parents/guardians. New parents to PL (Sec) must familiarise yourselves with these practices to ensure safety of all our girls.

On a related note, we seek parents' support to keep schools a safe environment for all our girls. If your child is unwell, please ensure that she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage her to exercise personal and social responsibility (e.g. by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups).

iii. Guidelines on Parents' Communication with the School. We pray and trust our parents/guardians will provide the best guidance and care for our PL-Lites, your daughters/wards. Take time to understand your daughter/ward and what goes on in her school life. Reinforce their good behaviours and set clear boundaries and expectations. My colleagues and I look forward to forging an even closer partnership with you as we work together to shape our PL-Lites' character and help them succeed in life. We must also remind our PL-Lites that they must take responsibility for their learning and growth too.
